2024 Delray Beach Open

The Delray Beach Open, an ATP Tour 250 tournament, returns for its 32nd year, and 26th in Delray Beach.

Top Americans

This year's Delray Beach Open draw includes the top three Americans in the world - **Taylor Fritz**, **Tommy Paul** and **Frances Tiafoe**.

Delray Beach Down Under

Several Delray Beach Open players had excellent results at last month's Australian Open, the first Grand Slam event of the year. **Taylor Fritz** reached the quarterfinals, **Adrian Mannarino**, **Miomir Kecmanovic** and **Nuno Borges** reached the fourth round, and **Tommy Paul**, **Juncheng Shang** and **Alex Michelsen** reached the third round. **Jan Zielinski** won the mixed doubles title, his first Grand Slam crown.

Grand Slam Greatness

Delray Beach Open alumni have combined for 50 Major singles titles, with 14 former DBO champions making a Grand Slam semifinal, final or winning a championship.

World Class Doubles

The doubles action is not to be missed, with two Grand Slam men's doubles champions (**Neal Skupski**, **Max Purcell**), one DBO doubles champion (**Gonzalo Escobar**-2021), three DBO doubles finalists (**Skupski**-2019, **Reese Stalder**-2023, **Aleksandr Nedovyesov**-2022) and a former world No. 1 doubles player (Skupski).

Back-to-Back Titles

Defending champion **Taylor Fritz** will try to become only the second player to win back-to-back championships in the 32 years of this tournament after **Jason Stoltenberg** in 1996-97.

Top Seeds Surging

The top seed has won this tournament only three times in its 31-year history, but two of them were in the last two years. All eight seeds have never reached the quarterfinals in the same year.

Oldest Winners

The oldest singles champion in Delray Beach Open history is **Ivo Karlovic**, who was 35 when he won in 2015 just a week before his 36th birthday. This year's oldest player, **Adrian Mannarino**, 35, would be four months younger than Karlovic if he won the title. The oldest doubles winners were twins **Bob** and **Mike Bryan** in 2020 at age 41, four months older than last year's champion **Jean-Julien Rojer**. This year, **Santiago Gonzalez**, half of the top doubles entry and oldest in the doubles draw, turns 41 one week after the tournament.

...And Better With Age

Adrian Mannarino cracked the Top 20 this year for the first time at age 35 after winning three titles last season. This year will mark his 11th appearance at the tournament, which ranks fifth on the all-time list.

Youngest Winner

Kei Nishikori was 18 when he won the DBO in 2008, becoming the youngest champion. There are two 19-year-olds in this year's main draw - **Alex Michelsen** and **Juncheng Shang**. Shang is the youngest, having turned 19 a week before the tournament.

Americans in the Top 50

There are seven American men ranked among the top 50 in the world.

Netflix Tennis Series

The Netflix series "Break Point" fol-

lows a few pro tennis players around the world for a behind-the-scenes look, and DBO players **Taylor Fritz**, **Frances Tiafoe** and **Tommy Paul** are three of those players featured. The second season is streaming now.

NCAA Titles

There are several players in the draw who played in college before turning pro. One is an NCAA singles champion - **Marcos Giron** of UCLA (2014). **Nuno Borges** lost in the NCAA final in 2019, ending a 31-match winning streak.

Next Gen

Chinese player **Juncheng "Jerry" Shang** has trained at the IMG Academy in Bradenton for several years. At one time he was coached there by former world No. 1 **Marcelo Rios**, a semifinalist in Delray in 2002. Shang entered the DBO as part of the Next Gen program, reserved for players age 20 and under ranked in the Top 250.

The History of the Delray Beach Open



Mark Baron's love for tennis grew when he began volunteering at junior tournaments around the country. Eager to continue his passion for the game, Baron, who retired from the clothing business in 1991, began the quest for starting a Tour-level event. After two successful Challenger tournaments in Pembroke Pines, Baron felt he had enough to submit a bid to host an ATP tournament. His wish was granted in 1993, with the tour awarding Baron an event that would see future Major champions, Olympic gold medalists and rising stars in men's tennis.

In the ensuing 32 years, the Delray Beach Open has grown into the world's only 10-day ATP Champions Tour and ATP 250 event. Top players from the ATP Tour compete in front of over 60,000 screaming fans in an event that is televised nationally and internationally in over 100 countries. Delray Beach Open alumni include 10 World No. 1s, 11 Olympic gold medalists and 15 Grand Slam winners.

Coral Springs was the tournament's site from 1993-1998 and first called America's Red Clay Championships. Despite little sponsorship, the inaugural draw included seven-time Major champion and Tennis Hall of Famer **Jimmy Connors**, 1986 French Open finalist **Mikael Pernfors** and **Andres Gomez**, the 1990 French Open champion. **Todd Martin** became the event's first singles champion in 1993, his first career title on the ATP Tour. He eventually moved into the top 10 rankings and reached a pair of Major finals.

Being the first top 10 player to participate in the tournament, the ninth-ranked Martin looked to repeat in 1994. American **Jared Palmer** upset Martin in the first round on his way to the quarterfinals. The second year also showcased a thrilling second round matchup between **Ivan Lendl** and **Mats Wilander**, who have a combined 15 Major championships. Lendl bested Wilander in the third set 7-5 to reach the quarterfinals. **Luiz Mattar**, however, was the one to clinch the title in the tournament's second year.

Magnus Larsson, who came off a French Open semifinal run in 1994, earned the No. 1 seed for the 1995 main draw and faced wild card **Ivan Baron**, Mark's son. Ivan, who eventually would become tournament chairman, forced the World No. 11 to a first round exit for the second consecutive year. **Todd Woodbridge**, later a 1997 Wimbledon semifinalist, defeated 1997 US Open finalist **Greg Rusedski** in the singles final to become the tournament's third singles champion. Woodbridge became the first player in tournament history to win the singles and doubles titles in the same year, partnering with **Mark Woodforde** to win two straight doubles titles in 1995 and 1996.

Just two months after winning the event in 1996, **Jason Stoltenberg** reached the semifinals at Wimbledon before defending his title in 1997. The tournament's only back-to-back winner eyed a three-peat in 1998, but the No. 1 seed was knocked out by **Andrew Ilie**, the first qualifier in the event's history to claim the championship.

The tournament moved its home from Coral Springs to the Delray Beach Stadium & Tennis Center in 1999. Playing on clay courts in Coral Springs and in its first year in Delray Beach, the tournament shifted to a hard court event in 2000 where it's played on the same surface today.

A pair of 18-year-olds highlighted Championship Sunday, where future two-time Major champion and Tennis Hall of Famer **Lleyton Hewitt** became the first singles champion in Delray Beach after defeating **Xavier Malisse** in 1999. Hewitt's title in Delray Beach was also his first title won in the United States. Following **Stefan Koubek's** championship in 2000, American **Jan-Michael Gambill** was the second player in tournament history to win both the singles and doubles titles in the same season in 2001.

A new tennis star emerged in the event's 10th edition. Fresh off a doubles title the previous year with Gambill, Boca Raton resident **Andy Roddick** was hungry for a singles title in his own backyard in 2002. Roddick claimed the No. 1 seed after being given a wild card the previous two years and reached the final, falling to **Davide Sanguinetti**.

After losing to Sanguinetti in the semifinals the previous year, Gambill bounced back with the singles title in 2003 to become the second two-time champion in tournament history.

To accommodate the 2004 Summer Olympics, the Delray Beach Open was played in September and the event was unfazed by the effects of Hurricane Frances landing just six days before. The 12th edition was completed from start to finish, with **Ricardo Mello** winning the singles title. Less than a week after completing the 2004 tournament, Hurricane Jeanne struck the city of Delray Beach. Once again, the 2005 edition carried on just four months after disaster struck and Malisse capped off the event with his first career singles title.

In his final season on the ATP Tour, eight-time Major champion and future Tennis Hall of Famer **Andre Agassi** took his No. 9 ranking to Delray Beach in 2006. Agassi lost in the quarterfinals and **Tommy Haas** was the one to defeat the defending champion Malisse in the final to claim the tournament championship. Malisse answered the bell in 2007, defeating World No. 6 **James Blake** in the final in the only year of the round robin format. He became the third player in tournament history to win the singles and doubles titles in the same year. Malisse was also the third player in Delray Beach Open history to win multiple singles titles.

No. 1 seed Blake, the 2007 Davis Cup champion and Australian Open quarterfinalist, met 18-year-old **Kei Nishikori** in the 2008 final. Nishikori blasted his way from qualifying to the singles title and became the youngest player in tournament history to claim the title. He was also the second qualifier to win the tournament along with the first Japanese man in nearly 16 years to win an ATP Tour event.

A top seed claimed the title in Delray Beach for the first time in 2009, when American **Mardy Fish** captured the crown for his third career championship on the ATP Tour. One-third of Delray Beach Open champions have been unseeded. That year was also the first Delray Beach Open doubles title for 10-time ATP Tour No. 1 doubles team **Bob & Mike Bryan**.

Delray Beach started the 2010s decade by welcoming the first ATP Champions Tour event in the United States since 2001. The Hall of Fame matchups eventually become a signature attraction of opening weekend. Two-time US Open champion **Pat Rafter** defeated seven-time Major champion **John McEnroe** in the all-Tennis Hall of Fame final. **Ernests Gulbis** won his first career singles title while the Bryans repeated as doubles champions at the ATP 250 event in 2010.

Sidelined by a wrist injury for several months of the 2010 season, 2009 US Open champion **Juan Martin del Potro** received a special exemption for the 2011 main draw. Del Potro did not lose a set on his way to the Delray Beach Open crown in his comeback. McEnroe and Wilander shut down downtown Delray Beach to play a friendly game of tennis on Atlantic Avenue in front of more than 1,000 bewildered city-goers in the same year.

Kevin Anderson won the singles title on the 20th anniversary of the tournament while Gulbis became the fourth player in the tournament history to win multiple singles championships in Delray Beach in 2013. Gulbis' title marked the third time in tournament history a qualifier won the championship.

After **Carlos Moya** won back-to-back titles on the ATP Champions Tour event, Delray Beach transitioned into a team format. Headed by a pair of former Delray Beach Open champions in Roddick and Gambill, Team USA defeated Team International 8-1 in the first year of the team format in 2014. **Marin Cilic**, who went on to win the US Open later that year, defeated Anderson in one of the most epic and longest finals in tournament history by clinching the third set 7-5. The Bryan brothers captured their third Delray Beach doubles title.

At 35 years old, **Ivo Karlovic** was the oldest champion in tournament history when he won the 2015 singles title. A pair of Americans snatched singles titles in the following two years, with **Sam Querrey** winning in 2016 and **Jack Sock** taking the 2017 crown. Sock won by walkover from **Milos Raonic**, who was the highest-ranked player in the tournament when he brought his World No. 4 ranking to Delray Beach.

After winning just three matches in five tournaments to start the 2018 season, 20-year-old American **Frances Tiafoe** accepted a wild card to play in Delray Beach. He went on to win his first ATP Tour title at the 2018 Delray Beach Open and became the youngest American man to win a title on tour since Roddick in 2002. The Delray Beach Open also set an attendance record of 66,005 fans over 17 sessions in 2018. **Radu Albot** became the first Moldavian to win an ATP event with his title in 2019 while the Bryan brothers claimed their fifth title in doubles.

Prior to 2020 halting the world with the COVID-19 pandemic, fans witnessed the first women's match of the Delray Beach Open. Delray Beach native and 15-year-old tennis star **Coco Gauff** played against NCAA Division 1 champion **Estela Perez-Somarriba** from the University of Miami in an exhibition match in front of a sellout crowd, where Gauff won in straight sets. The year also marked the final match for the Bryan brothers on the ATP Tour, who hoisted their sixth Delray Beach Open doubles trophy and 119th career title. **Reilly Opelka** won the singles title in his hometown.

Before his 2021 semifinal run at Wimbledon, **Hubert Hurkacz** claimed the singles crown over American **Sebastian Korda**. The Delray Beach Tennis Center was honored by the USTA with its Outstanding Facility Award months after the 29th edition of the event. In 2022, the top two seeds reached the final for the first time in tournament history. **Cameron Norrie** became only the second top seed to win the title, defeating Opelka in two tie-breaks. He continued his top form to reach the Wimbledon semifinals and crack the Top 10 later that year. Doubles champions **Marcelo Arevalo** and **Jean-Julien Rojer** went on to win the French Open just three months later.

Top seed **Taylor Fritz**, ranked No. 7, became the first current Top 10 player to win the title in 2023, and top seeds Arevalo and Rojer defended their doubles title. Attendance for the final was 5,211, second most all-time for any session in the tournament's 31-year history. All reserved, Veranda and Best Seats courtside tickets were sold out for the final, so the tournament opened the General Admission Grandstands to accommodate all additional fans.

BOB & MIKE BRYAN (USA)

DELRAY BEACH: Fourth ATP Champions Tour appearance... Record six-time doubles champions with a 30-7 record in the ATP 250 event, eight-time finalists... The 2020 title was their final ATP Tour tournament. **CAREER:** The winningest team in the sport's history with 119 titles, including a record 16 Major titles... They are the only doubles or singles players to sweep all four Grand Slams, nine ATP Masters 1000 events, the ATP Finals, and Olympic gold... The Bryan Brothers won 1,108 matches together, more than any team in the Open Era, and have the most victories by any doubles team in U.S. Davis Cup history with a 25-5 record, winning Davis Cup in 2007... The brothers finished No. 1 in team rankings 10 times during their careers. **PERSONAL:** Identical "mirror" twins – Mike is right-handed, Bob is left-handed... Bob was named the U.S. Davis Cup captain in 2023 and Mike is the team's doubles coach... California natives coached by their parents, Wayne and Kathy, starting at age two... Won more than 100 junior titles together... Played at Stanford University for two years, helping win both NCAA team titles and winning the NCAA doubles title in 1998; inducted into the Intercollegiate Tennis Association Hall of Fame in 2023... Created the Bryan Bros. Band and held concerts at tournaments and charity events worldwide... Hold an annual Bryan Brothers Foundation event to raise money for kids in Ventura County... Bob is married with three children; Mike is married with two children.



LUKE & MURPHY JENSEN (USA)

DELRAY BEACH: Luke's fourth ATP Champions Tour appearance and Murphy's third. The brothers played the ATP 250 doubles tournament together nine times, reaching the final in 1997 and SF in 1996 when the event was played in Coral Springs. **CAREER:** Won the 1993 French Open doubles title,

their first pro title together, and finished the year as the No. 5 team on the ATP Tour. Went on to win three more pro titles together and reached seven additional finals. Their four titles came on three different surfaces (hard, clay, grass). Luke won another six doubles titles with four other partners. Luke won the Boys 18s Nationals, Clay Courts and Hard Courts in 1984 as well as the French Open junior doubles title with Patrick McEnroe. He later won All-American honors while playing at the University of Southern California. Murphy won a pair of Orange Bowls among his 10 national junior doubles titles. He played two years at USC before transferring to Georgia where he was an All-American. **PERSONAL:** Luke, who is two years older, and Murphy grew up on a Christmas tree farm in the small town of Ludington, Mich. Their younger twin sisters, Rachel and Rebecca, also played tennis professionally. Luke is nicknamed "Dual Hand Luke" for his ability to play with both hands. Both brothers have worked extensively in television. Murphy coached in World Team Tennis for 10 years and was named coach of the year in 2013. He is now co-founder and EVP of WEconnect Health. Luke coached the Syracuse women's tennis team for seven years.



JESSE LEVINE (CANADA)

DELRAY BEACH: Playing the ATP Champions Tour here for the sixth time. Also played the ATP Tour tournament on four occasions. **CAREER:** Reached a career-high ranking of No. 69 in 2012. Defeated former world No. 1 Marat Safin at 2009 Wimbledon. Reached the Houston doubles final in '09. Won five career Challenger titles in eight finals. Practice partner for Roger Federer. Born a Canadian, the lefty represented the US from 2007-12 before becoming eligible to play for Canada in 2013 on the Davis Cup team. Put together a 24-1 freshman record All-American season ('06-'07) at the University of Florida where he was named National Rookie of the Year. Was 21-0 in regular season dual matches and reached the NCAA quarterfinals. In the juniors, won the 2001 USTA Clay Court 14 Nationals singles title, the boys' 16s doubles title and the 2005 Junior Wimbledon doubles title. Reached the Jr. Wimbledon singles quarterfinals in 2005. **PERSONAL:** Levine has coached WTA top 10 and US Open finalist Madison Keys, WTA top 5 player Jessica Pegula as well as helping out 2017 Delray Beach Open finalist Milos Raonic. Inducted into the Ottawa Jewish Sports Hall of Fame in June of 2018. Jesse is also a talent scout, a TV broadcaster, and Director of Racquet Sports at Shell Bay Club.



TOMMY HAAS (GERMANY)

DELRAY BEACH: Making his fifth ATP Champions Tour appearance and is a two-time champion of the event... During ATP 250 career, posted an 11-8 record, winning the 2006 title in his debut... Tied for sixth-most appearances in tournament history with nine. **CAREER:** Spent eight years in the Top 20 of the ATP rankings, reaching a career high No. 2 in 2002... Won 15 titles in his career, winning eight consecutive finals from 2004-12... Overall, contested 28 finals, including a silver medal at the 2000 Sydney Olympics... A three-time semifinalist at the Australian Open, he also reached one Wimbledon semifinal... Over the course of his career, defeated Agassi, Djokovic, Federer and Sampras at least three times each... **PERSONAL:** Serves as Tournament Director of combined ATP and WTA 1000-level event in Indian Wells... Part of the San Diego Stingrays ownership group in the Pro Padel League... Wife is actress Sara Foster and they have two daughters.



KEVIN ANDERSON (RSA)

DELRAY BEACH: First time playing the ATP Champions Tour event. Won the ATP 250 tournament in 2012 with wins over Andy Roddick and John Isner. Finalist in 2014. Played the tournament eight straight years 2010-2017 and again in 2022. **CAREER:** Career-high ranking of world No. 5. Advanced to 1st Grand Slam final at 2017 US Open as No. 32, becoming lowest-ranked US Open finalist in history and 1st African US Open finalist in Open Era. Reached 2nd Grand Slam final at 2018 Wimbledon. Won 2006 NCAA doubles title at Illinois. Retired in 2022 but came back in 2023 and played last match at US Open. **PERSONAL:** Recipient of 2019 Arthur Ashe Humanitarian Award and 2020 ATP ACES for Charity grant to benefit First Serve. Member of ATP Player Council from 2012-22, serving as president in 2020.


IVO KARLOVIC (CROATIA)

DELRAY BEACH: Second year to play the ATP Champions event. Won the ATP 250 event in 2015. **CAREER:** Achieved career-high No. 14 in 2008 after defeating No. 1 Roger Federer enroute to ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati SF. Eight-time ATP Tour champion. At 2019 Pune became the oldest tour-level finalist at age 39 since Ken Rosewall, 43, in 1977. Ranks second among all players since ATP stats have been kept (1991) in career aces with 13,728 (retired ranked first; John Isner surpassed him in 2022). Holds single-match ace records for ATP Tour (45), Australian Open (75), Roland Garros (55), US Open (61) and Davis Cup (career-high 78). In 2009 reached the Wimbledon QF. **PERSONAL:** Retired after the 2021 season. Tied with Reilly Opelka as tallest pro players in history at 6'11". Wears size 17 shoes. Ambassador for ACEing Autism, which exposes autistic children to tennis. Awarded an ATP ACES for Charity grant for \$15,000 in 2016. Wife, Alsi; daughter, Jada Valentina; son, Noah.



SAM QUERREY (USA)

DELRAY BEACH: Second year playing the ATP Champions Tour event. Played the ATP Tour event 12 times, tied for third all-time, and won the title in 2016. **CAREER:** Achieved career-high No. 11 in 2018. Winner of 10 ATP Tour titles, including Mexican sweep in 2017 at Acapulco (def. Rafael Nadal) and Los Cabos. At Wimbledon, advanced to 2016 QF, 2017 SF and 2019 QF, defeating Novak Djokovic in 2016 and Andy Murray in 2017. Snapped Djokovic's Open Era-record 30-match Grand Slam win streak at 2016 Wimbledon, then set an Open Era record by reaching 1st Grand Slam SF in his 42nd Grand Slam appearance at 2017 Wimbledon. Collected 23 wins over Top 10 players. Hit unprecedented 10 straight aces at 2007 Indianapolis. **PERSONAL:** Retired from the ATP Tour after the 2022 US Open and now playing professional pickleball. Grew up in Southern California. Fan of Los Angeles Lakers (NBA). Had the opportunity to take batting practice at the Hard Rock Stadium in Miami in 2008 during the Miami Open and hit 2 home runs. His father, Mike, was a baseball player and was drafted by the Detroit Tigers (MLB). Wife is Abby and sons are Ford and Owen.



SCOVILLE JENKINS (USA)

DELRAY BEACH: Making his third appearance on the ATP Champions Tour in Delray Beach. Played singles in the ATP 250 event in 2007 when it was a round-robin format; advanced through qualifying to win a match in the round-robin stage. **CAREER:** First African-American to win the Boys' 18 USTA National Hard Court singles championship, in 2004. Recorded professional wins over future world No. 5 Kevin Anderson, No. 12 Dominik Hrbaty, No. 13 Jarkko Nieminen and No. 18 Vince Spadea. Won a US Open main draw match and also played French Open main draw. Played Grand Slam matches against then-No. 1 Roger Federer, No. 2 Rafael Nadal and No. 2 Andy Roddick. Reached a career-high world ranking of 187. In juniors, reached the 2004 Wimbledon boys' semifinals, US and Australian Open boys' quarterfinals and held the No. 6 ITF junior world ranking. **PERSONAL:** Currently a tennis professional at The Club at Ibis in West Palm Beach. Served as associate head coach for the men's tennis program at Oklahoma State after previously coaching at Wisconsin, Washington and Kennesaw State. Earned sociology degree while coaching at Washington.

For over six decades, Evans has been a preeminent voice on tennis as a journalist and historian. Since Wimbledon in 1960, he has reported on over 200 Grand Slams and numerous other tournaments, including the Delray Beach Open.He has authored 23 books on Open tennis, Davis Cup and the sports' legendary players. In 1973 he became the ATP's first press officer. From 1974-77, Evans served as ATP European Director in Paris to help professionalize events. In 1977, he was voted onto the ATP Board of Directors and was instrumental in conceptualizing and proposing the creation of ATP University for players embarking on professional careers.
